Building Racine County



- Racine has historically had one of the highest unemployment rates in Wisconsin
- City of Racine Water Utility to contract for expansion
- Utilities expansion will require additional skilled workers for infrastructure construction projects
- With \$160 million INFRA Grant awarded, WisDOT contractors will need skilled construction workers

Building Racine County



- City of Racine approved an unprecedented \$500,000 investment in workforce development to prepare residents for jobs
- Stipulation: match money, double trainees
- City-county-state partnership, will fund \$1.5 million in workforce development

Wisconsin Fast Forward



- Wisconsin Fast Forward program was signed into law in March 2013 with the nearunanimous support of the State Legislature
- Wisconsin Fast Forward helps businesses address the need for skilled workers or the "skills gap"
- The program created worker training grants to prepare workers for jobs available today and in the years to come

Wisconsin Fast Forward



- Grants support employer-led worker training with demonstrated high demand for both incumbent and new workers
- Grants are open for application year-round with evaluations and awards done at the end of each quarter
- Grants can range from \$5,000 to \$400,000 and require a dollar-for-dollar match

Wisconsin Fast Forward




- Is a reimbursable grant program
- Encourages targeted workforce collaborations
- Over 20,000 employees have gained additional skills with the support of the Wisconsin Fast Forward program
